 - External Obligations and Events
 - False Promises of Continuing
 Treatment Elsewhere
- Addressing and Countering These Excuses

Consequences for Leaving Treatment AMA





- Immediate and Long-Term Risks
 - Resumption of Substance Use
 - Legal and Employment Issues
 - Health and Safety Risks
 - Impact on Family and Relationships
- Real-Life Outcomes and Statistics
